An authorized representative is a person who is acting on the patient's behalf and who does not have a conflict of interest with the patient, when the patient is temporarily or permanently unable to act for himself or herself. This person should have the patient's best interests at heart and should be reasonably expected to act in a manner that is protective of the person and the rights of the patient. Preferably, this individual is appointed by the patient.
