APTA spokeswoman Nicole L. Stout is a renowned health care researcher, consultant, educator, and advocate. She is chief executive officer of 3e Services, an executive IT consulting firm, where she serves as a medical affairs consultant for biotech and wearable technology firms. Additionally, she supports the Office of Strategic Research at the National Institutes of Health, Rehabilitation Medicine Department, leading the Cancer Rehabilitation Initiative.

She is an internationally recognized expert and leader in cancer rehabilitation and lymphedema. She is author and coauthor of more than 50 peer-reviewed publications and book chapters, and is coauthor of *100 Questions and Answers About Lymphedema*. Her research publications have been foundational in developing the Prospective Surveillance Model for breast cancer rehabilitation.

Stout received a bachelor's degree from Slippery Rock University of Pennsylvania, a master's degree in physical therapy from Chatham University, and a doctor of physical therapy degree from Massachusetts General Institute of Health Professions. She also holds a postgraduate certificate in health policy from the George Washington University School of Public Health. She is certified by the Lymphology Association of North America and Six Sigma, and is a certified health data analyst.

She is an appointee on the CARF International Cancer Standards Advisory Board, the American Lymphedema Framework steering committee, and the ISPRM Global Cancer Initiative. She is current chair of the Oncology Specialty Council of the American Board of Physical Therapy Specialties, and serves as co-chair for the American Congress of Rehabilitation Medicine's Cancer Networking Group Education Taskforce. Stout is the recipient of numerous research and publication awards, and she has received service awards from the National Institutes of Health Clinical Center, the Navy Surgeon General, and the American Congress of Rehabilitation Medicine.
