APTA spokeswoman Nicole L. Stout, PT, DPT, is a renowned health care researcher, consultant, educator, and advocate. She is chief executive officer of 3e Services, an executive consulting firm, advising clients in policy, research, and marketing strategies that enable greater and more sophisticated use of technology for operational improvements. Her clients include industry leaders in health care, aviation, and education in the US and abroad.

She currently serves as project leader on the National Institutes of Health Rehabilitation Medicine Department's Cancer Rehabilitation Initiative. She is an internationally recognized expert and leader in cancer rehabilitation and lymphedema. She is author and coauthor of more than 40 peer-review publications and book chapters, and is coauthor of *100 Questions and Answers About Lymphedema*. Her research publications have been foundational in developing the Prospective Surveillance Model for breast cancer rehabilitation.

Stout received a bachelor of science degree from Slippery Rock University of Pennsylvania, a master of physical therapy degree from Chatham University, and a doctor of physical therapy degree from Massachusetts General Institute of Health Professions. She also holds a postgraduate certificate in health policy from the George Washington University School of Public Health. She is certified by the Lymphology Association of North America and Six Sigma, and is a certified health data analyst.

She is an appointee on the CARF International Cancer Standards Advisory Board, the American Lymphedema Framework steering committee, the ISPRM Global Cancer Initiative, and the National Lymphedema Network's Board of Directors. She is current chair of the Oncology Specialty Council of the American Board of Physical Therapy Specialties, and serves as co-chair for the American Congress of Rehabilitation Medicine's Cancer Networking Group Education Taskforce.
