

## Catherine Worthingham Fellows of APTA Instructions for Writing a Letter of Support

Following is information designed to assist persons asked to write a letter of support for a nominee for the American Physical Therapy Association's Catherine Worthingham Fellow membership category. *Please carefully read all information below prior to writing a letter of support.* 

#### **General Information**

- Catherine Worthingham, PT, PhD, FAPTA, was a change agent who was effective, respectful, and honest, and motivated others to make an impact within the physical therapy profession. She was also a visionary who demonstrated leadership across the domains of advocacy, education, practice, and research.
- The purpose of the Catherine Worthingham Fellow designation (FAPTA) is to honor Dr. Worthingham and inspire all physical therapists to attain the high level of professional excellence and impact in terms of advancing the profession she exemplified.
- The FAPTA designation is the highest honor among APTA's membership categories.
- Each nomination packet must include specific evidence of a nominee's excellence in one primary domain (advocacy, education, practice, or research) and translation of contributions and achievements across two of the three non-primary domains. Please note that current Board of Directors members are not eligible to be nominated and shall not nominate, write letters of support, or endorse an individual for this honor and members of the Awards Committee Catherine Worthingham Fellows Subcommittee shall not nominate, write letters of support, or endorse an individual for this honor.
- A nominee's curriculum vitae provides a listing of the nominee's accomplishments. Nomination and support letters should go beyond such a listing and should elaborate on the accomplishments to help illustrate how the nominee has:
  - o demonstrated excellence in one primary domain (advocacy, education, practice, or research);
  - made significant contributions, achievements, or leadership in at least two of the three non-primary domains; and
  - o advanced the physical therapy profession through frequent and sustained efforts for a period of not less than 15 years preceding the nomination.

Please see the sample descriptions at the end of these instructions of how a nominee's contributions and achievements within a primary domain and translation across the other two of three non-primary domains might be reported. This table is designed to assist with writing letters of nomination and support and aid writers with accurately describing why a member should be elected as a Catherine Worthingham Fellow. The examples are intended to provide greater clarity regarding the depth and breadth of contributions that distinguish an individual as deserving of the Catherine Worthingham Fellow designation (FAPTA).



## **Letter of Support: Details/Instructions**

#### Writer Responsibilities

The writer of a letter of support for a Catherine Worthingham Fellow Nominee is responsible for:

- Carefully reading the current Catherine Worthingham Fellows policy. This policy may be updated every year, so it is imperative that you review the current policy to ensure you are aware of any changes and account for those in your letter of support.
- Writing a clear and compelling letter of support that does not exceed 2 pages.
- Sending the finished letter of support in a timely manner to the nominator.

### Tips for Writing a Letter of Support

#### If you are an APTA member writing a letter of support you should:

- Clearly indicate:
  - o the name of the individual being nominated, including all professional designations;
  - o your name including all professional designations; and
  - the institution or facility with which you are affiliated and in what capacity you work with, have worked with, or otherwise personally know the nominee.
- Provide an explicit account of how the nominee meets one or more of the Catherine Worthingham Fellow criteria (see below) supported by appropriate details and examples drawn from the nominee's professional career.
  - o **Criteria 1**: How has the nominee demonstrated excellence in a primary domain of advocacy, education, practice, or research? Please highlight and elaborate on the contributions and achievements of the nominee that are noteworthy and standout in terms of their quality and/or set a new standard for the profession.
  - Criteria 2: How has the nominee been nationally recognized for the impact he/she has achieved in his/her primary domain of advocacy, education, practice or research? Provide specific examples of how the nominee's impact has been recognized by APTA members and by leaders outside the physical therapy profession.
  - Criteria 3: How have the nominee's frequent and sustained contributions (leadership, influence, and achievements) advanced the profession over a period of not less than fifteen years? The information provided in this section should illustrate a nominee's track record of consistent contributions to moving the profession forward over a period of 15 years or more. Please consider a nominee's contributions across appointed, elected, employed, and service-related positions and roles as well as those that are a result of his/her tenure in any particular position or role.
  - o **Criteria 4**: In what definitive ways have the nominee's contributions and achievements



promoted/encouraged the progress, growth, or acceptance of the physical therapy profession?

- **Criteria 5**: The nominee should demonstrate leadership and achievements in at least two of three non-primary domains.
- Reflect genuine knowledge and consideration of the nominee's qualifications for the membership category of Catherine Worthingham Fellow of APTA.

If you are an individual external to the physical therapy profession writing a letter of support, it is important for your letter to:

- Clearly indicate:
  - o the name of the individual being nominated, including all professional designations;
  - o your name, including all professional designations; and
  - o the institution or facility with which you are affiliated and in what capacity you work with, have worked with, or otherwise personally or professionally know the nominee.
- Address the nominee's notable contributions relative to advocacy, education, practice or research in physical therapy as judged from outside the profession
