

Physical Therapist Member Demographic Profile 2016-2017

The Physical Therapist Practice Profile is a survey conducted by the American Physical Therapy Association (APTA) to elicit information from its PT members on a number of issues that are important to the profession. The following tables present demographic data for physical therapists by sex, race/ethnic origin, age, number of years in the profession, highest earned academic degree, professional (entry-level) degree, employment status, and employment facility/setting. The survey was conducted in late 2016 and early 2017. A total of 47,620 survey emails were successfully delivered and 7,490 responses were received (15.7%). Because respondents did not always answer all items, the sample size may vary across tables.
