Legislative Issues Advocating for the Profession on Capitol Hill

- Medicare payment reform and annual inflation payment update (H.R. 2474)
- [Change PTA supervision to general supervision under Medicare Part B outpatient practices \(H.R. 4878/S. 2459\).](#)
- Allow PTs in all geographic regions to enter into locum tenens arrangements under Medicare Part B outpatient practices (H.R. 1617/S. 793).
- [Add PTs to the National Health Service Corps Loan Repayment Program and community health centers \(H.R. 4829\).](#)
- Add PTs and PTAs under Medicare Part B as permanent authorized providers of telehealth services (H.R. 3875/S. 2880).
- [Raise awareness of the availability and importance of pelvic health services, particularly pelvic health physical therapy, for postpartum women using Medicaid and the Children's Health Insurance Program \(H.R. 2480\).](#)
- Reverse cuts to home health care services (S. 2137).
- [Reduce administrative burdens for PTs and PTAs including prior authorization and plan of care certification \(H.R. 8702/S.4532\) and \(H.R. 7279\).](#)
- Expand and increase access to Falls screening and prevention under Medicare (H.R. 7618).
- [Full federal funding of the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act \(H.R. 4519/S. 3213\).](#)
