

Call for Session Proposals



APTA Combined Sections Meeting Feb.
13-15, 2025 | Houston, Texas

The specialty academies and sections of the American Physical Therapy Association hereby issue a Call for Session Proposals.

Proposal submission deadline: April 15, 2024, 11:59 p.m. PT

Proposals for APTA CSM educational sessions and preconference courses are submitted online through APTA's submission site. The decision to accept or reject a proposal, and matters regarding the final content, format, and scheduling of any presentation, rests with each academy/section as represented by that entity's program chair.

THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION IS SUBJECT TO CHANGE.

Proposal submissions for education sessions must contain the following:

- Title (15 words maximum).
- Session description (250 words maximum).
- Session learning objectives (four maximum).
- Minimum of five to seven current bibliographic references, no more than seven years old at time of CSM presentation.
- Timed outline of content that aligns with learning objectives.
- Total of content related to differential diagnosis (expressed in minutes).
- Speaker information, including name, degrees/credentials, institution, city, state, and speaking experience for each speaker.
- Biographical information for each speaker.
- Keywords to help potential attendees search for the session topic.
- Teaching and learning assessment methods.
- Recommended content level (fundamental, intermediate, advanced).
- Conflict of interest disclosure.

Proposal submissions for preconference courses must contain the following:

- All of the above pertaining to educational session submissions, **plus:**
- A commitment that, if selected, the submitter will provide a 25-question, multiple-choice posttest to assess learning. Each question must correspond with a learning objective. This learning assessment is required for continuing education unit approval.

Important things to remember when submitting your proposal:

- **The same proposal may not be submitted to multiple sections.**
- The APTA academies/sections have agreed to limit a speaker to three accepted sessions within their individual programs. This includes both primary speaker and co-speaker positions.
- Speaker information will appear exactly as submitted in all APTA CSM publications. Contact co-

presenters to ensure the accuracy of this information before finalizing your submission.

- Proposals may be for two-hour educational sessions or for one- or two-day preconference courses.
- If you have content exceeding two hours for an educational session, you may submit two two-hour sessions, designating in the title that it is part 1 or part 2.
- Selection of proposals will be based on foundation in evidence, clarity of proposal, probable interest to participants, fiscal feasibility, and space and time constraints.
- Proposals should reflect cultural and/or ethical components related to clinical practice and research, as related to session content.
- Proposals should be devoid of any promotional content.
- Use your APTA member login to access the submission site and submit your proposal. If you do not have a member login, you can create one, or contact Member Success at 800-999-2782.

Acceptance of speaker responsibilities

If your proposal is selected for an educational session or preconference course, you will be asked to sign a form agreeing to speaker responsibilities. Since there are a lot of moving parts involved in preparing for APTA CSM, our conference timeline is necessary to make sure everything stays on track.

- Every speaker or co-speaker must sign the speaker agreement(s) in their Speaker Center, if accepted for a session/course.
- You agree to meet all deadlines (deadline reminders will be sent to chairs); however,
- If you cannot meet a deadline you must contact APTA Events Programming staff at eventprogram@apta.org with notification.
- Please include reference to your academy/section and the title of your approved session or course in all communications to streamline processing by staff.
