

# State Laws Related to Commercial Payer Telehealth Parity



Some states have laws that govern how commercial payers provide coverage and payment for telehealth visits compared with in-person visits. The scope of these laws varies widely. For example, some laws require equal coverage and equal reimbursement for telehealth and in-person visits. Other laws require equal coverage but not equal payment.
